Art and DT

The children will be developing their art skills by creating Ancient Egyptian artefacts. As designers, the children will be creating an Egyptian shaduf.

Geography and History

The children will develop their understanding of geography through learning about Egypt and rivers. They will learn about the importance of rivers in the lives of all the people of the world and specifically about why The Nile is and was such an important river in Egypt.

Super Skills

Each week your child will read within a group or as a class, with the teacher, interpreting and making inferences about a variety of texts. The focus of these sessions will:

- •Enable pupils to identify and comment on the structure, features and organisation of texts;
- Probe understanding and interpretation of texts by promoting the use of deduction, inference and interpretation of ideas or events;
- •Enable pupils to explain, comment on and respond to a writer's use of language;

•Teach strategies to enable pupils to summarise, generalise and develop an overview of the text.
