School Swimming

We are pleased that our swimming season has started well. (Just a plea - please try to ensure that your child has a named swimming hat please!)

Thank you for the contributions we have already received towards this and we would be grateful to receive any amounts still outstanding. The children are enjoying their daily swim and are getting high quality daily exercise. We are so lucky to be able to offer this excellent facility on site.

Learning to swim is an entitlement for all children and is a compulsory National Curriculum subject. Jon Glenn, Swim England Director of Learn to Swim says: "Primary school is often the only place that a child will have the opportunity to learn about water safety and basic swimming skills. That means we have to ensure that no one falls through the net. Learning about water safety and knowing how to keep yourself safe in and around water is a life-skill and as such, should be recognised and measured in the same ways as other key subjects such as maths." The Department for Education has just updated its guidance and schools now must publish their swimming attainment levels.

The National Curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety (by Year 6) are:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
