## **CORONAVIRUS, COVID-19**

Naturally there have been some questions about what we are doing about coronavirus (COVID 19). First of all, as a school we have spent a lot of time telling the pupils the importance of hand washing and also showing pupils how to wash their hands. Each toilet has copies of a song that children can sing (This is the way we wash our hands) whilst washing their hands. We are asking children (and staff) to wash hands as they enter school in the morning, when they return to class from playtimes, before and after lunchtime and before leaving school at the end of the day. All visitors will also be asked to wash hands when entering and leaving the school. Each classroom is furnished with boxes of tissues.

The most recent advice I have received is:

- If there has been a suspected case, no restrictions or special control measures are required while laboratory test results for COVID-19 are awaited. There is no need to close the setting or send other learners or staff home.
- If there has been a confirmed case, we will be contacted by the local Public Health Protection Team to discuss the case, identify people who have been in contact and then be advised on any actions or precautions. An assessment will be undertaken by the Health Protection Team and we would follow their direction.
- The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of a new <u>continuous</u> cough and/or high temperature. If you have these symptoms, however mild, stay at home and do not leave your house for 7 days from when your symptoms started. You do not need to call NHS 111 to go into self-isolation. If your symptoms worsen during home isolation or are no better after 7 days, contact <u>NHS 111 online</u>. If you have no internet access, you should call NHS 111. For a medical emergency dial 999.

If you do need to self-isolate please contact the school and also keep us updated as to your progress.
