Dear All,

It was lovely to see Sapphire Class Worship. This was put together totally by the pupils using their slides and their words: it was extremely impressive. This week also saw our Ruby Class performing a violin concert for the rest of the school. It is amazing at how quickly our children begin to master new experiences.

Ukraine

Head Lice

Head lice are an almost permanent fixture in almost all primary schools. It is parental responsibility to detect and administer treatment for head lice to their own children. Could you please check your child for head lice once a week using a nit comb (which are available from the local chemist). Detection and effective ongoing treatment of head lice is key to reducing outbreaks. The treatment should include the washing of all towels, bedding etc be washed at a high temperature. COVID - 19

As you are aware, we have had 2 positive Covid-19 cases this week.

COVID-19 advice for educational settings states:

Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to their educational setting if they normally attend one, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. They should follow the guidance for their educational setting.

The listed COVID-19 symptoms are:

- A new, continuous cough, and/or
- A temperature, and/or
- A loss of, or change to, sense of taste and/or smell.
