<p>Bethlehem</p> <p>A small town near Jerusalem believed to be the birthplace of Jesus.</p>	<p>Birth</p> <p>When a baby leaves the mother's body and starts life as a separate being.</p>
<p>Good News</p> <p>Christians believe that God came to earth to bring 'good news' to everyone, even poor people. The 'good news' was about God and how to be close to him.</p>	<p>Worship</p> <p>To show devotion and love to a religion.</p>
<p>Celebrate</p> <p>To acknowledge a significant happy day or event</p>	<p>Advent</p> <p>The arrival of a notable person, thing or event.</p>
<p>Jesus</p> <p>A central figure of Christianity. Believed to be the Son of God.</p>	<p>Precious/special</p> <p>Something or someone of great value to be respected and not treated carelessly</p>
<p>Christian</p> <p>A person who follows the religion of Christianity.</p>	<p>Earth</p> <p>The planet on which humans live.</p>
<p>King</p> <p>A male ruler</p>	<p>Baby</p> <p>A very young child.</p>
