School Clubs Spring Term II

All Saints Primary School is proud to be able to continue to help busy parents manage their work commitments around the school's timetables by providing early morning and after school support with a Breakfast Club and Afterschool Care. During this Spring term the breakfast programme will continue to be run by the **All Saints** team who are fully committed to delivering high quality care and our afterschool clubs will continue to be supported by a mixture of professional partners and All Saints teachers. These include:

Monday: 3.30-4.30: Dance Crew Miss Scott

Miss Scott will continue to offer this vibrant and creative dance club.

Tuesday: 3.30-4.30: Go Fencing with Premier Sports .Org

Go fencing is a fast, exciting and athletic sport, like 'active chess' and keeps both body and mind fit. As well as learning plenty of social skills, getting physically active and having great fun with friends, participants will also learn the key attributes to develop and sometimes excel in the sport. Children will learn the following key Fencing/|Sporting skills: Tactics, Techniques, Confidence, Self-discipline, Speed, Etiquette, Striking, Balance, Posture, and Independence & Rules

Wednesday: 3.30-4.30: Mindfulness with Miss Withers

This club will provide an hour of quiet to aid mindfulness through guided activities, colouring and relaxing exercises. The outcomes are to help the children feel calmer and more fulfilled, to get on better with others, and be able to concentrate better.

Thursday: 3.30-4.30: We are offering two clubs:

Football with Mr Rich

Tony Rich is a qualified football coach who has been working with the school for the past 5 years. Within that time Tony has truly developed the skills of club members resulting in lots of success for the All Saints Football team when playing against other schools.

Origami with Mrs Parsons

The Japanese word "Origami" itself is a compound of two smaller Japanese words: "ori", meaning to fold, and "kami", meaning paper. Origami is a fascinating and creative craft for children, especially when the origami models are appropriate to their age and skills. The children get a real sense of satisfaction out of making fun origami models, and they get practice at following instructions, increasing their manual dexterity, and produce a fun and decorative end-product.

Friday: 3.30-4.30: Nerf Wars with Premier Sports

Nerf Wars Club is target practice with nerf guns. It is a highly supervised club that focuses on teamwork and communication as well as expert targeting. All the equipment is provided including goggles to protect eyes. As the weeks go by the children will compete in small, strategic battles where they will be split into two teams and complete a variety of games. (Maximum of 16 people – excellent behaviour and listening skills must be demonstrated by the children)
