School Trip Information

Tuesday 24th October 2017

Visit to the Bovington Tank Museum



Dear Parents and Carers,

We have been lucky to be able to book a day at the Bovington Tank Museum where we are going to be able to learn about life in World War 2 through two workshops: Britain in WW2 and The 1940's house. We will then spend the afternoon looking at further exhibits within the museum.

Within the first workshop, we will be learning about how they dealt with the Blitz and about organisations such as the Home Guard, ARP and Women's Land Army. There will also be an opportunity to explore the Museum's extensive collection of Second World War artefacts. Pupils can try on a range of gas masks, helmets and uniforms and try out a real (and very loud!) hand-cranked air raid siren.

Within the 1940's house workshop, the children will discover what life was like at home in the Second World War inside a reconstructed 1940's house and experience a 'real' air raid in an Anderson shelter. Pupils will find out how people in the 1940s grew food and planned their meals. They will also explore the contents of an evacuee's suitcase and recognise the difficult decisions families had to make when they sent their children away.

The date of our trip is **Thursday 16 November 2017.**

What your child will need:

- Light weight coat
- Comfortable footwear (trainers)
- School uniform – please ensure your child is wearing their school uniform
- Packed lunch
- Water bottle

Fortunately we will be travelling by coach within school times so normal drop off/pick up applies.
