Key Vocabulary:

Celebrate	Having a party or day to remember to be thankful for someone or something.
Past	Something that has already happened.
Religion	Something that people believe, that may be celebrated.
Commemorate	To remember officially and give respect to a great person or event, especially by a public ceremony.
Custom	A traditional and widely accepted way of doing something that is specific to a person, time or place.
Festival	A day or period of celebration.
Tradition	Customs or beliefs that are passed on from generation to generation.

Some Religious Celebrations to remember from this half term...

Christianity – Epiphany, Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Pentecost, Advent, Christmas Day.

Islam – Day of Hijra, Mawlid al-Nabi, Laylat al-Qadr, Eid-al-Fitr, Dhu al-Hi jja, Eid al-Adha.

Judaism – Shabbat, Purim, Passover, Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Hanukkah.

Hinduism – Holi, Mahasivaratri, Ram Navami, Janamashtami, Navaratri, Dussehra, Diwali.
