The families who attended were buzzing about the evening on Monday morning and a brilliant time was had by all! We extend further huge thanks to Sarah Challis for organising this and making All Saints one of the beneficiaries with a large donation which the school will use to fund some much needed resources for our youngest children.

#### Wrap around Care at All Saints

As you know All Saints has been offering a morning breakfast club and After School Care since September. We researched this carefully and were very committed that any care provided would offer physical activity to help our children stay fit and active. We have been delighted that Jamie, our sports coach, has delivered high quality coaching and care before and after school. However, not as many families, as was hoped following the initial questionnaire, have subsequently taken up this provision. Being able to offer this to families remains very important to us. We believe in supporting our community by:

- giving working parents the ability to select All Saints for their children's education
- providing the opportunity for children to engage with an extra sporting activity
- providing access to a sporting activity without the need for transport / cost of transport

However, if this is not required by our families we may have to adapt the level of service we currently provide. In order to make the best decisions around this please take a moment to complete and return the form attached to this letter. The Governors are very committed to being able to continue to offer this provision for families already accessing it and will do all in their power to maintain it.

#### Wednesday PE

Every Wednesday Mr Noyes teaches PE across the school. We cannot change the day or time and except in extreme weather conditions, it is our intention that the children are active outdoors for at least 45minutes. Now that the weather is getting colder please ensure that children have sufficient warm clothes and most importantly **TRAINERS** for games on the field. Black daps are not suitable for these sessions. Thank you very much for your support.

#### **School Matches / Competitive events**

All Saints takes up many opportunities for competitive sports fixtures and wishes to continue to do so. Regretfully, the school is unable to organise transport to and from these events as this must be the responsibility of parents/carers. Please understand that this is necessary to be compliant with school Health and Safety. Therefore please ensure that you have made arrangements for your child's transport before agreeing that they can take part in events. Thank you.

#### Attendance

You can find a copy of our Attendance Policy on our school website. This is a common policy with all the local partnership schools.

All Saints School continues to work towards the following targets

- for attendance rates to reach 97%
- for all absences to be legitimate and authorised
- to increase the numbers of pupils who achieve 100% attendance in the school year
- to reduce the numbers of families taking holidays during term time
- for all children to arrive on time for school, unless there is a legitimate reason for not doing so.
