## **Outdoor PE**

Can we please ask you to support your children to be equipped for our PE sessions on Wednesdays? As we employ a sports coach it is our intention is that these sessions will take place outside in all but the most extreme weather. Last Wednesday over half of one class did not have adequate clothing for outdoor PE. I'm sure you understand that this results in the loss of valuable teaching time as we attempt to ensure the children are adequately dressed. Following half term the weather will be getting considerably colder and the field muddier! For outdoor PE the children require:

- Long sports trousers
- A polo shirt
- A long sleeved warm sweatshirt
- Outdoor trainers (black daps are not suitable when the field is damper)
- Girls wearing tights will need socks for PE.

All items are available from our school uniform suppliers but if alternative suppliers are used please ensure these are plain (no logos) black, grey or blue. Please ensure all clothing is named.
