Gentle Reminders....

Attendance and Punctuality: Well done all the children who received certificates for attendance at the end of the Autumn term. 49 children had attendance that exceeded 97% and out of those, there were 17 children who hadn't had a single day off school last term. THANK YOU SO MUCH to those families who have been working hard to ensure children's punctuality and attendance is high. THANK YOU for getting these important life skills established early on in your child's life as it will make a difference in their futures.

We have a number of trigger points for individual attendance and do issue letters informing you if you are approaching one of these. This is so that we can work with you to support improving this wherever possible, so that important learning time is not lost more than is absolutely necessary. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

I'd like to remind parents/carers that the school day at All Saints starts at **8:55am** when children's learning begins. Start of day sessions are tailored to children's individual areas of development and are essential, this is also often the time when teaching assistants are hearing readers 1:1.

We understand that we all run late sometimes. For your child, arriving late to school occasionally will not cause major disruption and inevitably, sometimes circumstances will prevent them from being on time. However, consistent lateness eventually takes its toll on a child's overall educational experience and this can significantly reduce achievement, regardless of academic ability. Children who are often late may have trouble settling in and mastering routines and may disrupt a class that is already settled to learning. Sometimes children miss out on being able to talk to their teacher in the morning or on finding out about what they are learning that day.

At All Saints, we allow time for children to enter school and get settled for the day, which we believe is important. A staff member is available to greet children at the door, but they need to be in class at 8.55am so the main door has to be closed promptly.

However, an increasing number of children are being admitted via the office on a regular basis, at what can be a very busy time of the day here.

Being frequently late for school also adds up to lost learning:

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year

As a school, we make regular punctuality and attendance checks and this includes identifying children who are regularly late for school. This also forms part of a termly attendance report for the Local Authority, which also specifically highlights those children whose attendance has fallen below a certain percentage where there will be a negative impact on achievement. Please respect that issuing this reminder reflects our commitment to working together with parents/carers to provide children with the best possible start in life.
